



LEGIS LEAGUE FINALS SPECIFICATIONS

Hansen Dam Horse Park
April 22-24, 2022

HUNTER & EQUITATION FINALS

Riders will receive points (7-5-4-3-2-1) based on how they place in the classes of each Final. Ties will be broken by the most points over fences. If a tie still remains, the rider placings in the final jumping class will be used.

JUMPER FINALS

The results of the specific class will determine the rankings for each LEGIS League Jumper section.

LEGIS League Medal Finals

Riders must have earned four points in order to compete in any LEGIS League Medal Final and maintained eligibility, if the particular final has an eligibility requirement. Hunt seat riders are eligible to compete in both rounds 1 and 2, even if the rider receives no score in the first round. Ribbons will be awarded through tenth, along with special prizes. Riders who win a specific LEGIS League Medal Final are no longer eligible to compete in that medal class.

Scoring: Scores will be announced. In the hunt seat finals, scores from round 1 and round 2 will be averaged. The work-off score will then be added to the average of rounds 1 and 2, and then the average is taken again. In the jumper final, the work off score will be added to the first-round score to determine the winner. Any ties that occur at the conclusion of the work-off among work-off riders will be determined by the rider with the highest work-off score.

Results: Final scores after the work-off will determine the final placing of the work-off riders. In the hunt seat finals, the remaining riders will be placed by their average score after rounds 1 and 2. Any ties will be broken by the round 2 score. In the jumper final, the remaining riders will be placed by their first-round score. Any ties will be broken by the time taken in the second phase of round 1. Riders will be placed through tenth.

Work-offs: Any rider with a score of 80 or higher after the first round of the jumper final or with an average score of 78 or higher in the hunt seat finals will compete in the work-off. Specifications for work-offs are listed below.

Class Conduct: The order of go for the first round will be drawn, and the order for the second round will

be the reverse of the first round. A horse substitution due to injury or illness will be considered providing a vet certificate is provided and decided by the Show Manager and the USEF Steward. Any special circumstances that arise will be decided by the Show Manager, USEF Steward, and official LEGIS League representative. Their decision will be final.

Awards & Presentations: Ribbons will be presented in each round, and championship ribbons and prizes will be awarded to the overall top ten. In addition, the LEGIS League Top Medal Finals Trainer (trainer of champions) will receive a special plaque. Riders are expected to ride for overall awards and the trainers of winners are expected to be available for the presentation ceremony and dressed appropriately.

- LEGIS League Mini Medal Final - Fences 2'0" USEF Tests 1-7
No oxers and no combinations
- LEGIS League Cornerstone Medal Final - Fences 2'6" USEF Tests 1-7
No combinations

The Mini and Cornerstone may be combined and held at split heights if there are fewer than six riders in either final.

- LEGIS League Children's Medal Final - Fences 3'0" USEF Tests 1-13
- LEGIS League Adult Medal Final - Fences 3'0" USEF Tests 1-13

The Children's and Adult Finals may be combined if there are fewer than six riders in either final.

JUMPER MEDAL FINAL - Fences 1.0M/ 3'3"

To be judged as a Jumping Seat Equitation class and held in the jumper ring over a Table II, 2d (two phase) type course, with all riders (except those eliminated) continuing to the second phase.

First Round: The first round course will consist of not more than eight obstacles in the first phase and not more than six obstacles in the second phase. Jumps will be set at 1.0m with spreads to 1.10m. The course must include at least one double combination, and a minimum of three oxers. A liverpool may be used but only as an option jump. Time allowed in the second phase will be calculated at 350 m/m. There will be no time allowed in the first phase.

Work-Off Round: Any rider with a score of 80 or above will return for a work-off over a jump-off style course. Riders are not expected to ride at speed but should demonstrate an appropriate time saving track and style.

Judging: Riders will be judged on style, technical merit and use of an efficient, time saving pace and track with jumping and time faults being deducted from the rider's equitation score (4 points deducted for each rail down and 1 point deducted for each time fault). Two refusals will eliminate.

Scoring: The score from the first round will be added to the score from the work-off round (if held) to determine the overall winner. Those not participating in the work-off will be placed in the overall results based on their score from the first round. A rider must receive a score in the first round to be placed in the overall results.



Equipment: Running or standing martingales used in the conventional manner are legal. German martingales, draw reins, or other such devices are prohibited in all phases. Legal bits include snaffles, pelhams, gags, kimberwickes, and two or three ring bits. Any other bits (including but not limited to hackamores, etc.) are prohibited.
